The Thirsty Whale is a fun and unique restaurant serving great food with a wonderful entrée selection. The lights of Broadway shine brighter than ever in the Northwoods with live theatrical entertainment. Featuring professional actors from New York and across the country, **The Northern Lights Playhouse**, nestled among towering pines, has 299 new cushioned theatre seats and open air windows that allow you to sit back and relax with the utmost comfort. Wednesday, August 25

A delicious **continental breakfast** will be available at the hotel before we begin our morning adventures to **Waswagoning**, a local Native American Village. Walk back in time to when the Ojibwe built wigwams and moved from area to area as the seasons changed, making articles out of natural elements for survival. Wear comfortable walking shoes and join a fascinating walking tour through traditional Indian villages depicting a way of life that honored the seasons, the earth and natural resources. Enjoy lunch at the actual site of a 1934 gun battle between John Dillinger and the FBI; **Little Bohemia** was used as the set of Public Enemies, a blockbuster film starring Johnny Depp. Following lunch we are off to the **Scheer's Lumberjack Show**. This show offers a unique blend of Wisconsin lumbering history, world class competition and plenty of hilarious comedy. Dinner for the evening will be at the **Norwood Pines Supper Club**. With a rich 70-year history, this supper club is rumored to host a friendly ghost named Edgar who hung himself in the former upstairs brothel. We will also watch one of the oldest amateur water ski shows in the United States perform. The **Min-Aqua Bat water ski club** originated in 1950 with a group of local young people water-skiing on Sunday afternoons.

Before retiring for the evening, listen to some local folklore and enjoy s'mores as a local ranger shares his experiences and some good old-fashioned story telling around a **Northwoods' campfire!**

Thursday, August 26

Luggage is out and loaded, and we are off for a hearty all-you-can-eat Lumberjack breakfast at **Paul Bunyan Meals**. Enjoy hot coffee in tin cups, sugary homemade buttermilk donuts, sausage, ham and eggs, potatoes and more before we begin our departure for home. A stop at the **Northwood's Petroleum Museum** will bring back the memories as you view this private collection of more than 2,700 pieces of service station memorabilia. The quality of this museum must be seen to be believed! Our next stop at **Three Lakes Winery** will offer wine tasting and cheese samples as well as other gourmet food items. A stop in Antigo at the **Refuge** will offer a delicious break as we head home. One last adventure in Antigo is for all of our fishermen and women at **The American Home of Mepps**. We will take a guided tour and watch how the world's #1 lure is hand-made and maybe even pick-up a few fishing pointers. It is time to return home with many wonderful memories of our great Northwood's Escape.
